

# UNDERSTANDING YOUR CHILD'S REPORT CARD

## (GRADES 3-5)

Your child's **report card** reflects a learning process supported by standards in Rockwood curricula.

Parents will note some changes in their child's elementary report card. This report card for grades 3-5 is designed to better communicate your child's progress on many levels. It will share information two ways: a four-point system and a letter grade system.

A four-point system shares progress toward end-of-year expectations in English Language Arts and Mathematics with the following information:

- 4: Exceeds the grade-level expectations for the standard.
- 3: Meets the grade-level expectation for the standard.
- 2: On track to meet the grade-level expectations by the end of the school year.
- 1: Needs additional support in order to meet the grade-level standard.

All other content areas give letter grades that reflect student learning for the current quarter. Please note that the two systems are not representative of each other.
